## Bad Prayers (creeping works-righteousness)

**LBW p. 21:** Almighty God, we have celebrated with joy the festival of our Lord's resurrection. Graciously help us to show the power of the resurrection in all that we say and do; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you . . .

(Second Sunday of Easter)

In other words: "Get going! We need to show the power of the resurrection in what we do."

**LBW, p. 27:** O God, we thank you for your Son who shows the path of suffering for the sake of the world. Humble us by his example, point us to the path of obedience, and give us strength to follow his commands . . .

(Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost)

In other words: "We can and should be obedient."

**LBW, p. 15:** Lord God, you showed your glory and led many to faith by the works of your Son. As he brought gladness and healing to his people, grant us these same gifts and lead us also to perfect faith in him, Jesus Christ our Lord.

(Second Sunday after Epiphany)

In other words: "He did good works. We must do good works. Finally it's all about doing good works."

**What's wrong with these prayers?** On the one hand, all prayer is defective so there are no "perfect" prayers. On the other hand, we should not therefore willfully use prayers which contain **a creeping works-righteousness -- as if we can and have to do works which are needed for our salvation.**
